Hello, I'm Adie. Born in South Africa, my heart always yearned to contribute to a cause bigger than myself. Yet, life's demands made it challenging to find the time for charitable endeavors. At the bimonthly book packing sessions through our collective effort I know that we are bringing smiles to the faces of countless underprivileged children in Africa. The warmth and camaraderie shared amongst the volunteers creates a passionate synergy.

Today, my passion for ABCA's mission has ignited the same flame in my children, who now proudly volunteer alongside me. The universe indeed works in mysterious ways, and for me, it guided me to a cause where I can make a real difference.





City Kidz, Johannesburg

ABCA books were delivered to CityKidz Primary School, which is situated in an industrial area in the Johannesburg inner-city.

ABCA donated books to the school many years ago, and they contacted us again this year to ask for more books. The school has grown over the last few years – they have students attending from the inner-city, Hillbrow and Soweto.

The school does not have a library, but each classroom has its own reading corner with many books. The school held a competition for the class with the best reading corner, and are also in the process of running a Spelling Bee competition. The students are encouraged to read as much as possible. Every week, each student takes a book home to read, and the parents are encouraged to read at home together with their children. The school were very appreciative and excited to receive ABCA books, and sent us many photos of the students looking at the books!
















Inkwenkwezi, Soweto


We delivered ABCA books to Inkwenkwezi Primary School in Soweto. Most of the students at the school come from the squatter camps nearby – they don't pay school fees and receive a meal at school each day (usually their only food for the day).

The teachers were very excited and sincerely appreciated all the books as they know the value of reading, especially for these students who don't have anything where they live. We received a warm welcome from a few students from each grade who had specially prepared a presentation for us. The younger students read their books, and the older ones recited the introductions to the South African Constitution and the African Union Constitution. The students had picked flowers to welcome us to the school.

Mr Lekgalake, the principal, is very passionate about his school and improving the lives of his learners. Monde Mtenjana, who contacted ABCA for the books, took us on a tour of the school. It is well maintained but needs upgrading, which they don't have the funds for and are looking for sponsors to help them. A classroom with shelves was meant to be the library, but was instead being used as a storeroom for textbooks. The school want to convert this room into a proper library for the students to enjoy the books!

A few Grade 7 girls helped with the library and were beyond excited. The book the girls were so intrigued by, was about Aussie animals!

Bosmont Primary School did not have a library, and recently converted a storeroom at the school into a library. They needed books for the shelves, but as there were no funds, the school were relying on donations of books to fill the shelves.
