Book distribution to Rotara School (written by Lauren Klevansky)

On Monday 5 September, ABCA visited Rotara School, on the edge of Carltonville, far south of Johannesburg. This is a very special school and caters for young people with mental and physical disabilities. There are 160 students, ranging in age from 5 years to 21 years.

The school is meticulously maintained, even though they have been without electricity for a few months since their cables were stolen. The students are treated with respect and their self-confidence is reinforced constantly. Each teacher has an assistant in the classroom, which helps to maintain control and a calm environment. As the students reach the senior classes, they are taught life skills and job skills and are then given the opportunity to work in many businesses nearby.

The library and media centre are housed in a small room, which has games the teachers can use in the classrooms and a small quantity of books which fill one shelf. The teachers encourage the children to read (if they can) or to look at the pictures. They were so happy to receive five boxes of books from us, which will go a long way in encouraging the students to read and use the books. The children who came to take a look at the books were so excited, it really warmed our hearts.

We are so grateful to have had the opportunity to visit such a special school and give them the beautiful books lovingly packed and sent from Australia
















Book distribution to McAuley House, Johannesburg (written by Lauren Klevansky)

McAuley House is a school in Johannesburg with students from Grade R to Grade 12. The school recently renovated their library, but only had old books, with no funds to get more books. They desperately needed new books and were very happy to receive ABCA books for their library.

The Grade 2 students were excited to see the new books and asked the librarian to keep the books for them to read for when they next visited the library. The matriculation students also wanted to keep the books they saw in the boxes! The librarian, Lilly, does excellent work in encouraging the students to read. There is a 'Bookflix' poster with pictures of recommended books, and students write book reviews which get attached to the books. The students also discuss books in groups and help each other with words they don't understand. It was a pleasure for ABCA to assist with the culture of reading at the school!







Book distribution to Protea South Resource Centre (written by Lauren Klevansky)

In August ABCA donated books to Fingertips of Africa, a charity established during the COVID pandemic to feed those in need. Fingertips of Africa delivered ABCA books to the Protea South Resource Centre near SOWETO. The resource centre is a safe space for children in the community, and helps to keep the children off the streets as there are high incidences of child rape in the area. The older children help the younger children with their homework, and the children receive a meal at the soup kitchen. We are very happy to have provided ABCA books for the children to read!
